Maths:

The children will be learning about place value in numbers up to 1 million; what does each number in a number mean? Can the children write the number in words? Then, we will be revising our knowledge of the four operations and applying them in a range of contexts. Secure times tables knowledge will be a great benefit.

Art & Design: We will be learning about a variety of artists, architects and designers as well as improving the mastery of various techniques, including, painting and sculpture with materials.

Physical development: Dance is the main focus of this topic but games will be included too. In dance, we will perform dances using a range of movements and patterns. PE lessons will take place on a Friday for all Y6 pupils.

Computing: This term computing is all about e-safety and being safe online. We will develop our understanding of securing our safety in a digital world.

Music: In music, we will be improvising and composing music for a range of purposes using the interrelated dimensions of music using recorders.

English: We will be developing our understanding and ability to write leaflets about artists. We will also be studying the book 'Framed' and this will involve writing short narratives around the ideas from the book. We will further develop our understanding of SPAG and ability to apply it in everyday writing tasks.

Geography: We are going to be locating the world's countries using maps to focus on Europe and North and South America. We will comment on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities.

History: The historical focus during this topic will be around the history of art.

Homework: The children are expected to complete their homework every week. Homework is given out on a Thursday and is expected in by the following Tuesday at the latest. Children should read every day and have their reading diary signed at least once per week. Maths, English and spelling tasks will be given as homework.
