



## I am a Warrior!

**I am warrior! I am strong, brave and powerful. Meet me in battle. Draw your sword, wield your axe and challenge me if you dare! Invade and attack, Romans versus the Celts, the fight is on...**

**Discover warring Britain: meet Claudius, Boudicca and Julius Caesar, and find out what the Romans did for us.**

### Maths:

The children will be learning multiplication and division methods; they will be focussing on division with remainders. Children will be working on multiplying 3 digit numbers with numbers up to 10. They will work on long division where they will be working on dividing 3 digit numbers.

**Art & Design:** The children will explore Roman mosaics and create a mosaic.

**History and geography:** The children will research the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. Children will use a range of source material to answer questions about the past which go beyond simple observations

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**English:** The children will be writing historical narratives about Roman warriors. Children will be looking at Shakespeare and play writing. They will also be reading Roman/Latin poetry and write some of their own poems.

### Homework:

The children will be set homework on a half termly basis and will be expected to hand it in at the end of the term. Work will consist of a literacy, maths, topic and weekly spellings. Children will have to access Activelearn regularly to work on Bug club and Abacus tasks. They will also be expected to use Timestable Rockstar frequently. Children are expected to read every day. The reading diary must be signed or initialled 3 times by an adult, weekly.

### Science:

We will be investigating states of matter and electricity. Children will learn parts of a plug and electric cable; they will also learn how to wire up a plug.

### Physical development:

In our PE lessons we will be focussing on basketball, team building skills and physical drills for our outdoor sessions. During indoor sessions we will learn to play handball, team relay and dodge ball. We will continue to emphasise team ethics and ensure all classes cooperate effectively.

**Music:** Alongside regular extra singing assemblies we will look at Roman music.

**Computing:** The children will find out about a significant Historical figure and their impact on Roman Britain and present a fact file in PowerPoint.

### Religious Education:

We will be looking at Gods transforming power and its meaning. We will also be learning about the Christian calendar.
