Deep down in the Anderson shelter, learn why nations are fighting and why child evacuees must make the long journey from their homes and families into unknown territory. As peace is declared, let's get ready to celebrate. Mr Churchill says 'It's an unconditional surrender!'

Maths: The children will develop their understanding of fractions and decimals. There will also be an emphasis on problem solving and developing their reasoning skills using real life maths problems.

Computing: The children will look at blogging and its place in the world today during Computing sessions.

Physical development: The children will develop their games skills and dance.

Geography: We will locate cities and ports that were bombed during the Blitz. We will consider why these places and the surrounding areas were vulnerable to bombing.



English: We will be developing our understanding and ability to write historical stories, diaries and letters. The children will focus on choosing the correct tense for their writing and looking to include a range of sentences in their writing.

History: We will learn about WWII, through a timeline and ordering of key events. We will focus on the experiences of children during the war, with particular emphasis on the evacuees.

Science: The children will learn about how animals and humans keep warm. Pupils will also develop their ability to read and interpret scientific equipment accurately.

Homework: The children are expected to complete their homework every week. Homework is given out on a Thursday and is expected in by the following Tuesday at the latest. Children should read every day and have their reading diary signed at least once per week. Maths, English and spelling tasks will be given as homework.
